

ORDINANCE 549-3-12

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF DUMPSTERS
(AND NOT DECLARING AN EMERGENCY)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Roaming Shores, Ohio:

Section 1. For the purposes of this ordinance, a “dumpster” is defined as a container on wheels or otherwise capable of being lifted, which exceeds 16 cubic feet and used for the purpose of disposing of garbage, rubbish or construction debris.

Section 2. No person shall locate or allow to be located on their premises a dumpster except as follows:

a) A dumpster may be located for the purpose of construction or remodeling on the premises where such construction or remodeling occurs for a period of two consecutive weeks, not to exceed four weeks per calendar year. The Mayor may extend such period from two to an additional six (6) consecutive weeks on the basis of extensive remodeling or construction, delays caused by weather, or other just cause.

b) A dumpster may be located on commercial property for the disposal of garbage or rubbish arising from the use of such property, provided that the dumpster is fully enclosed and hidden from public view by shrubbery or wall.

Section 3. Any person found violating this ordinance shall be fined the sum of \$50.00 per day that such violation is continued to exist. Such person shall be given a written warning prior to citation, delivered by regular mail to the owner’s tax address as shown in the records of the Ashtabula County Treasurer/Auditor, or by posting a written notice on the door of the residence or other building on such location.

Section 4. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5. This ordinance is not an emergency ordinance and shall not take effect until thirty days after passage.
